
WHITCH OF ELECTION

Child protection

Occasionally we get asked as a school what to do if someone has a concern about a child's welfare. If we are in school then we are always happy for you to come in and raise concerns with either Mrs Adams or Mr Swindells, who are the safeguarding leads in school.

Staff Car Park

Can we please again remind parents that the staff car park should only be used by parents up to 8.30am and after 4pm. If you are using the staff car park in these times please only use the designated car parking spaces and do not park along the fences at any time. If there is not a space in the designated spaces please go back onto the road and park your car there. Teaching staff need to be able to load and unload heavy bags of books and resources each day and also get out of school in an emergency and this is getting increasingly difficult for them at the moment.
