#### **Dear Parents**

We are now halfway through this half term. We are so proud of all of our children and how well they are engaging with the work at home. Please remember there is no pressure at all to do more than you can do at any time. We understand that as the weeks go on this gets harder and harder to manage, and we all hope that the whole situation will soon start to become more positive and life can start to come back to a more normal way for us all.

We understand that for some parents having your child in school can seem like the better option for them but please believe us that for the moment only children who need to be in school should be in. The children in school are doing the same work as the children at home and your child will not be getting further behind by being at home.

Thank you to parents who have a place in school for only using the provision when you need it, as this means that our bubbles are not at full capacity every day and is helping us to keep our staff and the children in school as safe as we can. We are really sorry but we cannot fill those spaces created by a child not using their place on a particular day with another child, thereby creating a rota system for places, as this increases the size of that bubble and the amount of exposure the children and staff in school would have, and it is really important at this time to keep that risk to a minimum. Places in school have been allocated according to the criteria provided by the DfE and as this has filled our bubbles we unfortunately cannot offer additional places in school.

This week we were told by our Education Secretary that schools will be given two weeks notice before everyone will be invited to return to school, which hopefully means we will be given sufficient time to prepare for the day we all hope can arrive soon.

Thank you so much for all of your feedback on our remote learning. We are so pleased that most of you are finding this the right balance. We understand it can't be perfect for everyone, but we really are doing our best to support everyone in the best was possible. Teachers are always happy to help out if you need their support through Seesaw. A summary of our remote learning offer is now on our website under the coronavirus tab (I look forward to the day I can delete that particular tab, as it means life has returned to normal).

# **Young Voices**

I am sure it will come as no surprise to find out that Young Voices which has been planned for June 2020 has now been postponed until Jan/Feb 2022.
