


Phonics are repeated throughout all of our units and teaching types but the main phonemes introduced and focussed on in each of our teaching types is as shown below.

The phonemes above are introduced in each teaching type via a dedicated phonics lesson. We recommend teaching these lessons at the start of each appropriate year.

The phonemes are then revisited numerous times in each of the units within the various teaching types. As pupils move through the teaching types, the previous phonemes are consolidated and revised.

As well as the phonemes, pupils will also encounter the following Spanish linguistic and grammatical concepts as they progress through our units:

The pronunciation of the letters 'C' and 'Z' as **'TH'** in Spanish (depending on the vowel that follows).

Rolling 'RR' sound and rolling 'R' sound if a word starts with a letter 'R'.

'Hard' or 'soft' pronunciation of the letters 'G' and 'C' depending if the vowel after the letter 'G' or 'C' is a 'hard' or 'soft' vowel.
